Hello to all our members and friends, and welcome to the June Issue of Ratlines.

Club News:

Regular clubhouse sessions: Are now back in full operation! Every Tuesday and Saturday you'll see us beetling away at all sorts of things, and always willing to welcome members and visitors. And of course there's always the 'Solve the world's problems sessions' – with coffee. Just bring a sense of humour....

<u>Charity Status:</u> Brendon is currently well into the process of registering WBAC as a charitable association. This costs us nothing, may assist us in gaining future funding, and will also allow us to avoid fees at the garbage dump. Cairns City Council has advised us that we cannot get a garbage pickup from Tingira Street, and our old trick of getting the garbo that services the boat ramp to pick up an extra bin or two is no longer possible – it's all computer & GPS monitored these days, so we have to dump our own.

<u>Mail:</u> An application has been made to Australia Post for mail to be delivered to our site at 68 Tingira Street, Portsmith. This will remove our need to have a post office box and therefore save us the associated future cost. We now have a mailbox near the front gate, the number 68 is mounted above it, and hopefully this function will soon be operational. We'll keep you informed.

Ports North Master Plan: Progress on the Master Plan has been understandably delayed. PN are committed to the development of the plan - having contracted a consultancy group to do so - but common sense dictates that due to the economy downturn little may happen for some time. All we can do is wait and see whilst we remain in our current spot.

Insurance: Our insurance is now up to date with the new policy, and PN have been supplied the Certificate of Currency. We are extremely happy with the savings made.

Clubhouse:

What a busy time the past month/s have been!

Re-arranging the contents of the storage containers is now 95% complete, with a little more sorting of nuts, bolts and some unidentifiable & weird things to go. (a standard question during the sorting has been: "What the xxxxxxx hell is THIS thing?"). As a result of all the sorting, we find we have a substantial collection of yacht, boat, and sailing fittings. So, if you're in the market for some we have the range and the <u>best</u> negotiable prices.

Some 7 ute loads of 'stuff' have gone to the dump and we're now on first name basis with the staff there. Probably another couple to go.

New shelves have been installed in the containers and filled; two new timber woodwork benches totaling 5.4 metres are being built as we speak and will be mounted on the side of the orange container adjacent to the Pathfinder build.

Marc had made 4 new foldable wooden sawhorses more suitable to our group (they're much higher than normal), and our backs are eternally grateful!

Ports North have supplied us with quite a few cubic metres of roadbase to use as fill for the low, muddy spots around the compound. And they even spread most of it out! As a result, the swamp outside the front gate is gone, and a fair amount of the old Floria site has been filled in as well. Things are looking decidedly different in Tingira Street these days.
